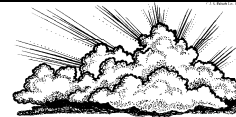

NEWS FROM THE OFFICE OF CATECHESIS

SUMMER TIME, FAMILY TIME! -- Sing along now, "Summer time, when the livin' is easy. Summer time, when the cotton is high. Yo' daddy's rich and yo' mammy's good lookin'. So hush little baby. Don't you cry." That song conjures images of families taking time to be together and create special memories. One opportunity families will have this summer to do that is to attend the **SUMMER BIBLE EXPERIENCE** here at Good Shepherd, July 11-15 (Mon.-Fri.), 6:30-8:30 pm. Fr. T will join the families for this special time and lead the adult group each evening, which will focus on learning and praying the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. The children's groups (ages 5-8 & 9-12) will use fun stories and creative activities to experience the power and presence of the Holy Spirit today. Children under the age of 5 will be able to go to the nursery. A summer time snack and game will end each evening. **REGISTRATION IS NECESSARY TO ENSURE ENOUGH MATERIALS ARE ON HAND.** Please sign the registration sheet posted on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board and indicate the number who will participate, and ages of children.

THANK YOU DID YOU KNOW that over 60 parishioners served in the ministry of catechesis this past year? It's true! Adults and teens served in the classrooms for children age 3 to teens age 18 either as assistants or catechists. Adults also led youth activities for middle and high school youth, trained catechists and parents in Safe Environment, prepared families to celebrate Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation. Children age 4 to 10 began to experience the power of the Scriptures each Sunday during the Children's dismissal, a new ministry this year. The RCIA Team prepared adults seeking to enter the Church as well as Catholic adults who wanted to complete their sacraments of initiation. Catholics who have been away from the Church for a while have been welcomed back by catechists willing to meet with them individually to answer questions. As a result of the lively faith of these parishioners, Good Shepherd Parish is fulfilling its mission to share the Good News. I am honored to have served with all of them and echo the words of St. Paul, "I give thanks to God for you always." Explanation of monthly collections

As you notice there are several collections you see every month, "**Social Hall**", "**Share Sunday**," and "**Clergy Retirement**." Have you been wondering what they are for and where the money is distributed? Here is a brief explanation of what we do with this money.

"**Social Hall**" collection helps pay the mortgage payment for the Social Hall which is used for all of our classes and social events. We ask each family to donate \$10.00 a month towards the Social Hall.

"**Share Sunday**" collection is given to several charities and organizations within the local area to include the ALMS House, Save the Babies, St. Isidore's Mission, CARE Clinic and St. Ann's Catholic School. The donations of food and other items are donated to the ALMS House and Save the Babies, House of Refuge.

"**Clergy Retirement**" collection is sent to the Diocese to help with the retirement of priests and other clergy members.

Etiquette Corner

Thank you for your presence here at Good Shepherd. In order to make our weekly celebrations more conducive to prayer, to preserve the sacredness of our liturgies and to ensure the comfort of all those who are gathered, the following are some gentle reminders of simple church etiquette.

Proper Attire:

Remember the time when people put on their "Sunday best" to go to church? In fact, dress clothes were often referred to as Sunday clothes in some parts of the country. Too often, dress in church has become very casual. In all areas of our lives, we should offer Christ our best, and the same is true of our dress. We should offer Christ our "Sunday best". We should dress modestly, not in a flashy way that would bring attention to ourselves. Our dress should always be becoming of a Christian - especially at church.

Our Children:

We encourage you to use our nursery which is available for the 8:30 and 11:30 Masses.

The nursery is for children 3 years old and younger. Children 4 years and older should attend Mass with their families.

If your child is attending Mass with you and begins to cry or be disruptive to those trying to pray around you, we gently ask that you take your child outside until comforted enough to rejoin our assembly prayer. The "Little Angels Haven" is also available for those with small children 3 and under.
