SBE IS ALMOST HERE! -- Our first annual Summer Bible Experience (SBE) will begin this Monday, July 11th and meet every evening from 6:30-8:30pm this coming week.

The children (ages 5-12) will gather downstairs in the classrooms, while the adults will meet with Fr. T upstairs in the RCIA Room. The adults will engage in a mini spiritual retreat as they take this opportunity to deepen their appreciation of the gift of the Eucharistic liturgy while learning the "why" of the upcoming changes to the translation of the Mass. The children will enter into the stories of Pentecost, Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, Sr. Thea Bowman, St. Paul and Archbishop Oscar Romero through interactive activities and crafts. Adults and children will end the evening with summer time snacks -- watermelon, pop cycles and ice cream sundaes. There will also be fun games for children and adults such as parachute bean bag toss, "shuffle your buns" and line dances.

WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A CATECHIST? -- Ask those who have served as a catechist. Most say it has been a rewarding experience that enabled them to grow in their own faith. In addition, catechists often express their joy at the faith and wisdom of the children, youth and adults with whom they are working. Catechists also feel affirmed and hopeful for the future of the Church. The catechist manuals that are used have consistently been rated as "very good" because of the detailed lesson plans and suggested activities for each lesson.

Catechist formation for those who have little or no experience is another resource offered through the parish for anyone interested in serving in this ministry. "Basic Training" includes attending sessions on the Vocation of the Catechist, Lesson Planning, Classroom Management Tips, Prayer, Scripture and Safe Environment Training (SET). Beginning August 7th, basic catechist formation will be offered on Sunday evenings, 6-8 pm. A sign-up sheet is posted on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board.
