NEWS FROM THE OFFICE OF CATECHESIS

WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A CATECHIST? --

Ask those who have served as a catechist. Most say it has been a rewarding experience that enabled them to grow in their own faith. In addition, catechists often express their joy at the faith and wisdom of the children, youth and adults with whom they are working. Catechists also feel affirmed and hopeful for the future of the Church. The catechist manuals that are used have consistently been rated as "very good" due to the detailed lesson plans and suggested activities for each lesson. Catechist formation for those who have little or no experience is another resource offered through the parish for anyone interested in serving in this ministry. "Basic Training" includes attending sessions on the Vocation of the Catechist, Lesson Planning, Classroom Management Tips, Prayer, Scripture and Safe Environment Training (SET). Beginning August 7th, basic catechist formation will be offered on Sunday evenings, 6-8 pm. A sign-up sheet is posted on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board.

Etiquette Corner

Thank you for your presence here at Good Shepherd. In order to make our weekly celebrations more conducive to prayer, to preserve the sacredness of our liturgies and to ensure the comfort of all those who are gathered, the following are some gentle reminders of simple church etiquette.

Proper Attire:

Remember the time when people put on their "Sunday best" to go to church? In fact, dress clothes were often referred to as Sunday clothes in some parts of the country. Too often, dress in church has become very casual. In all areas of our lives, we should offer Christ our best, and the same is true of our dress. We should offer Christ our "Sunday best". We should dress modestly, not in a flashy way that would bring attention to ourselves. Our dress should always be becoming of a Christian - especially at church.

Our Children:

We encourage you to use our nursery which is available for the 8:30 and 11:30 Masses.

The nursery is for children 3 years old and younger. Children 4 years and older should attend Mass with their families.

If your child is attending Mass with you and begins to cry or be disruptive to those trying to pray around you, we gently ask that you take your child outside until comforted enough to rejoin our assembly prayer. The "Little Angels Haven" is also available for those with small children 3 and under.
