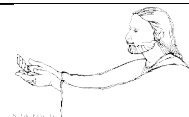

# NEWS FROM THE OFFICE OF CATECHESIS

**WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A CATECHIST?** -- Ask those who have served as a catechist. Most say it has been a rewarding experience that enabled them to grow in their own faith. In addition, catechists often express their joy at the faith and wisdom of the children, youth and adults with whom they are working. Catechists also feel affirmed and hopeful for the future of the Church. The catechist manuals that are used have consistently been rated as "very good" because of the detailed lesson plans and suggested activities for each lesson.

Catechist formation for those who have little or no experience is another resource offered through the parish for anyone interested in serving in this ministry. "Basic Training" includes attending sessions on the Vocation of the Catechist, Lesson Planning, Classroom Management Tips, Prayer, Scripture and Safe Environment Training (SET). Beginning August 7th, basic catechist formation will be offered on Sunday evenings, 6-8 pm. A sign-up sheet is posted on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board.

Also posted on the bulletin board is a list of classes scheduled for next year with the names of those who have volunteered to teach them. Early registration will guarantee a spot for all your children AND enable the Office of Catechesis to order the correct number of books for the start of the year. The schedule will remain the same - K-5th Grades will meet Sunday mornings, 9:45-11 am. Pre-school classes for 3 & 4 year olds during the 11:30 am Mass. Grades 6-12 will meet Sunday evening, 6-7:30 pm. Fees are \$30 per child; \$75 for a family of three or more children.
