RCIA "INQUIRY" PERIOD -- If you know someone interested in learning more about the Catholic Church in order to decide whether or not to become Catholic, please invite her or him to the Inquiry sessions, **that have begun and continue to meet at 9:45 am in the library.** The sessions are designed to answer participants' questions and give information on common misconceptions concerning the Catholic Church. Often friends and relatives are more willing to attend Inquiry if someone volunteers to attend with them, so consider offering to accompany your friend at least for the first session. REGISTRATION FOR CLASSES IN THE FALL -- Don't put off until later what you can easily do now. You may register your children by going to the parish website - www.good-shepherd-church.org. The form is located under the "Office of Catechesis link." Early registration will guarantee a spot for all your children AND enable the Office of Catechesis to order the correct number of books for the start of the year. The schedule will remain the same - K-5th Grades will meet Sunday mornings, 9:45-11 am. Pre-school classes for 3 & 4 year olds during the 11:30 am Mass. Grades 6-12 will meet Sunday evening, 6-7:30 pm. Fees are \$30 per child; \$75 for a family of three or more children.

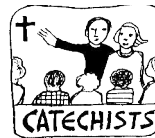

WHAT'S IT LIKE TO BE A CATECHIST?

-- Ask those who have served as a catechist. Most say it has been a rewarding experience that enabled them to grow in their own faith. In addition, catechists often express their joy at the faith and wisdom of the children, youth and adults with whom they are working. Catechists also feel affirmed and hopeful for the future of the Church. The catechist manuals that are used have consistently been rated as "very good" due to the detailed lesson plans and suggested activities for each lesson. Catechist formation for those who have little or no experience is another resource offered through the parish for anyone interested in serving in this ministry. "Basic Training" includes attending sessions on the Vocation of the Catechist, Lesson Planning, Classroom Management Tips, Prayer, Scripture and Safe Environment Training (SET). Beginning August 7th, basic catechist formation will be offered on Sunday evenings, 6-8 pm. A sign-up sheet is posted on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board.

Etiquette Corner

Thank you for your presence here at Good Shepherd. In order to make our weekly celebrations more conducive to prayer, to preserve the sacredness of our liturgies and to ensure the comfort of all those who are gathered, the following are some gentle reminders of simple church etiquette.

Leaving Before the Final Blessing:

Leaving church before the dismissal ignores another important part of the Liturgy. At the dismissal, we celebrate our commission as sent forth by Jesus Christ himself. In that, Jesus' last words to his disciples were "Therefore, go out and make disciples of all nations..... And behold, I am with you until the end of the age." Matt 28:19-20. Our liturgy has a beginning ("In the name of the Father ...") and an end ("Let us go in peace to love and serve the Lord...").

To leave immediately after Communion is to treat church like a fast food restaurant where we come and go as we please. We live in a fast-paced world where we seem to be hurrying from place to place. But in God's presence, we need to make every attempt to fight this pressure to move on to the next thing on the day's agenda. Eat and run at McDonald's - but stay in church and thank God for his precious gifts.

Proper Attire:

Remember the time when people put on their "Sunday best" to go to church? In fact, dress clothes were often referred to as Sunday clothes in some parts of the country. Too often, dress in church has become very casual. In all areas of our lives, we should offer Christ our best, and the same is true of our dress. We should offer Christ our "Sunday best". We should dress modestly, not in a flashy way that would bring attention to ourselves. Our dress should always be becoming of a Christian - especially at church.
