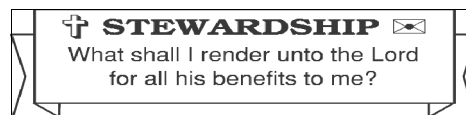

REGISTRATION FOR CATECHETICAL CLASSES IS EASY!

The registration form is posted on the parish website, located on the Office of Catechesis bulletin board and available from the office during regular office hours. If you take advantage of registration now you will ensure that your child will be able to attend the first day of class and not run the risk of being put on a waiting list. Registering for class now also enables the Office of Catechesis to correctly assess how many catechists need to be recruited and trained, order enough books and materials and to begin all classes on the first day of class - Sunday, Sept. 12th. So don't put off 'til tomorrow what you can do today!

Confirmation

CONFIRMATION FOR HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH

-- Diocesan policy for Confirmation requires two years of preparation - a remote year of preparation, which is held in the 9/10th year of high school - and a year of immediate preparation, which follows *immediately* after the year of remote preparation. High School youth in 10th-12th grade **who did not miss more than three classes** in the year of remote preparation will be eligible to register for the Confirmation class. Meet The Staff

Ever wonder who you should ask about certain things? Ever wonder what each staff member does? Hopefully this will answer some of your questions.

The Deacon—Deacon Pat helps the priest by taking one weekend a month and preaching the homily. This helps him to relax on those weekends. He also helps with funerals, provides pastoral counseling and marriage preparation counseling.

The Parish Administrator—Janice Scott—helps the priest by overseeing the administrative needs of the parish to include submitting the bulletin, publishing the calendar, maintains the financial records, pays the bills, submits the finance reports to the Diocese, schedules Mass requests, schedules use of the facility to include the rental of the Social Hall and orders flowers for the altar.

Office Assistant—Ann Provencher—inputs new parishioners into the computer system, provides annual tax statements to parishioners, provides envelopes to new members and all parishioners at the end of the year. She types the bulletin inserts for Easter Flowers, All Souls and Christmas Flowers. She also assists the Plant Manager.

The Director of Catechesis—Jan Carnahan—oversees all of the religious education classes to include the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) and Adult Formation. She is also responsible for recruiting Catechists for all grade levels and takes care of registration for all of the classes. Jan also oversees all activities scheduled by the Middle School and High School Youth Ministers.

Plant Manager—David Riley—ensures the church is in top running condition by taking care of any repairs needed, vacuums, dusts, straightens the books after the weekend masses and keeps the vigil candles re-supplied. He also ensures that the church grounds are well kept by picking up all pine cones and pine needles and cuts the lawn once a week during the warmer months. Dave sets up for the 50+ Club monthly. He also cordons off the parking lot for funerals and helps to keep the church in order.

Liturgy Coordinator—Paulette Munson—recruits Lay volunteers to serve in liturgical ministries—lectors, Eucharistic ministers, masters of ceremonies, ushers, altar servers and sacristans. She also schedules training for all the liturgical ministries.

The Middle School and High School Youth Ministers—Jeanette Hubbard and Frank Hogan, M.S. Youth Ministers and Ann Provencher and Tina Wing, H.S. Youth Ministers—collaborate with the Director of Catechesis to implement Total Youth Ministry as directed by the Diocese. They develop the annual budget and calendar, recruit chaperones, publicize, organize and chaperone youth activities and supervise the Youth Board. They make all arrangements for retreats, service projects and social events to include collecting fees and permission slips as well as submitting receipts for payment to the parish administrator.

Choir Director/Cantor—Dorothy Hinrichs/Susan Coyle—they direct the choir at all Masses each weekend and parish penance services, select the music for each liturgy, train choir members and direct weekly choir practice. They also ensure there is music for weddings and funerals when requested by parishioners.

Nursery Coordinator—Maureen O'Leary—provides child care during the Masses and catechetical sessions on Sunday mornings and evenings. She ensures the nursery is a safe environment, recruits and trains volunteers.

Council Chairpersons

Parish Pastoral Chair—Marty Moylan—Marty sets the agenda and chairs the council meetings in collaboration with the Pastor. He ensures parishioner suggestions and concerns are addressed in a timely manner and guides the council in its function as advisor to the Pastor.

Finance Chair—Steve Graybill—ensures the parish develops the annual budget in compliance with Diocesan procedures, provides a monthly finance report to the parish pastoral council and assists the Pastor in all financial matters.

Etiquette Corner

Thank you for your presence here at Good Shepherd. In order to make our weekly celebrations more conducive to prayer, to preserve the sacredness of our liturgies and to ensure the comfort of all those who are gathered, the following are some gentle reminders of simple church etiquette.

Arriving on Time:

We ask that you make every attempt to be on time (even early) to Mass. Remember to allow yourself enough time for parking and extra time if you need to drop off your children in the nursery.

Due to circumstances out of our control, we understand that there are times tardiness cannot be avoided. If Mass has begun, please enter through the side doors. Please wait for an usher to assist you since we do not seat people during particular moments of the liturgy, such as during the readings or the prayers. Remember that it is better to be present, even if late, than it is to be absent from the assembly. An alternative would be to wait until the next Mass.

Leaving Before the Final Blessing:

Leaving church before the dismissal ignores another important part of the Liturgy. At the dismissal, we celebrate our commission as sent forth by Jesus Christ himself. In that, Jesus' last words to his disciples were "Therefore, go out and make disciples of all nations.... And behold, I am with you until the end of the age." Matt 28:19-20. Our liturgy has a beginning ("In the name of the Father ...") and an end ("Let us go in peace to love and serve the Lord...").

To leave immediately after Communion is to treat church like a fast food restaurant where we come and go as we please.

We live in a fast-paced world where we seem to be hurrying from place to place. But in God's presence, we need to make every attempt to fight this pressure to move on to the next thing on the day's agenda. Eat and run at McDonald's - but stay in church and thank God for his precious gifts.

Proper Attire:

Remember the time when people put on their "Sunday best" to go to church? In fact, dress clothes were often referred to as Sunday clothes in some parts of the country. Too often, dress in church has become very casual. In all areas of our lives, we should offer Christ our best, and the same is true of our dress. We should offer Christ our "Sunday best". We should dress modestly, not in a flashy way that would bring attention to ourselves. Our dress should always be becoming of a Christian - especially at church.

Gum Chewing:

Please keep in mind that there should not be any gum chewing during Mass. We are to fast one hour before Communion to include chewing gum.

Our Children:

We encourage you to use our nursery which is available for the 8:30 and 11:30 Masses.

The nursery is for children 3 years old and younger. Children 4 years and older should attend Mass with their families. If your child is attending Mass with you and begins to cry or be disruptive to those trying to pray around you, we gently ask that you take your child outside until comforted enough to rejoin our assembly prayer. The "Little Angels Haven" is also available.

Parishioners, please save The "Little Angels Haven" space for the families with small children.

Phones and Pagers:

Please remember to turn off all cell phones and pagers before entering the church.

Please refrain from answering and talking on your cell phone while in the nave of the Church or near the altar. Please remember that you are in God's house and we need to show the proper respect.
