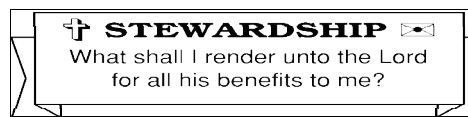

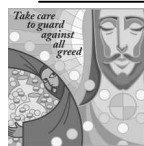

HAVE YOU REGISTERED YOUR CHILDREN FOR CLASSES YET?

There's no time like the present! You can go online to the parish website, print the registration form and mail or

bring it in to the Office of Catechesis. **Parish website - good-shepherd-church.org.** Registration forms are attached to the Office of Catechesis bulletin board in the Gathering Area and are also available from the Office itself during regular office hours. If you would like to serve as a catechist while your child is in class, contact Jan Carnahan, 425-5617. Many parents enjoy spending the time their children are in sessions growing in their own faith by serving as a catechist. CONFIRMATION FOR HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH

Diocesan policy for Confirmation requires two years of preparation - a remote year of preparation, which is held in the 9/10th year of high school - and a year of immediate preparation, which follows *immediately* after the year of remote preparation. High School youth in 10th-12th grade **who did not miss more than three classes** in the year of remote preparation will be eligible to register for the Confirmation class. 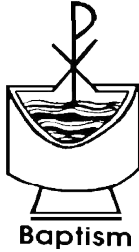

Explanation of monthly collections

As you notice there are several collections you see every month, “**Social Hall**”, “**Share Sunday**,” and “**Clergy Retirement**.” Have you been wondering what they are for and where the money is distributed? Here is a brief explanation of what we do with this money.

“**Social Hall**” collection helps pay the mortgage payment for the Social Hall which is used for all of our classes and social events. We ask each family to donate \$10.00 a month towards the Social Hall.

“**Share Sunday**” collection is given to several charities and organizations within the local area to include the ALMS House, Save the Babies, St. Isidore’s Mission, CARE Clinic and St. Ann’s Catholic School. The donations of food and other items are donated to the ALMS House and Save the Babies, House of Refuge.

“**Clergy Retirement**” collection is sent to the Diocese to help with the retirement of priests and other clergy members.

“**Diocesan Collections**” Sometimes we have National Collections from the Diocese.

Donation/Volunteer Opportunities

The Fort Fisher House, located on Fort Bragg, helps people in need. They are asking if we are able to help restock some of their much needed supplies. Items needed are: personal care kits: Shaving cream, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, soap; paper products: plates, cups, plastic ware; videos for children, canned food items. The deadline for donations is Aug 18th. You may place your donated items in the box located in the Gathering Area or Ann Provencher’s office.

Love Lunch Volunteers are needed. With summer vacation time upon us, many of our volunteers are able to take some much-needed time off. Our Love Lunch program is becoming very short on volunteers. The meals are still being served from the ALMS HOUSE twice daily, seven days a week. Volunteers are needed to pick up the meals from the downtown Fayetteville Salvation Army location and return them to the ALMS HOUSE where (generally two) volunteers set up a serving table with utensils for eating as well as put water and ice in a cooler for drinking. When the meals arrive, someone may read from the Bible and give a short devotion and blessing before the meal. Recipients are anyone who would like to have a meal. They are asked to sign in (primarily to have a count - and know how many meals are required.) The numbers are going up during the summer - perhaps from people out of work and children home from school. ALMS House

The ALMS HOUSE also welcomes volunteers Tuesday thru Friday from 9 a.m. until 12 noon. If you have extra time and are able to help in the ALMS House, please contact Dolores at 425-0902.

The ALMS House will be closed July 5-16 and August 1-13. Catholic Charities-Fayetteville Regional Office is in dire need of volunteers to help with their food pantry. Duties include making food bags for daily distribution, stocking food and inventory. You should be able to lift 15 to 25 pounds to stock our cases of food. We are needing volunteers to help pick up monthly food supplies from the food bank and grocery store, or assist in our Emergency Assistance Program (EAP) from 9:00am-12:00pm, Monday-Friday. Duties for EAP include answering phones, greeting clients, data entry, filing, and interviewing.

Catholic Charities is in need of school supplies for the children they assist in Cumberland and the surrounding counties. Items such as pencils, paper, notebooks, folders, binders, crayons, pens, markers, protractors, compass, rulers, scissors, glue sticks, calculators, and book bags.

Donations for our Children’s Closet are also needed. Items such as baby shampoos, baby wash, baby lotions, diapers (sizes newborn to 6) nightgowns, onesies, pacifiers, baby wipes, baby bottles, receiving blankets, socks, and clothes from sizes newborn to 12(Boys and Girls).
