NEXT TOPIC FOR WANDERING WEDNESDAYS -- The group decided to participate in the next course offered by the Diocesan Catechetical Institute, "Introduction to Christian Morality: Life In Christ." On Wed., Sept. 28th, the group will begin the six-week study of Catholic moral teaching about our relationship to God and others using the text, "The Essential Moral Handbook: A Guide to Catholic Living." SERVICE MINISTRIES

Women of Charity: A Christ centered group that prayerfully participates in outreach activities and service projects for our parish community and the greater community. It is open to all women and meets on the first Wednesday of the month following the Wednesday evening services. You may participate from home by making many of the items that are used to distribute to others in need.

Welcoming Ministry: Four times a year, the parish hosts a welcoming dinner at the Rectory for new members of our faith community. Volunteers help prepare and host the dinner.

Parish Social Life Committee is a pool of volunteers that assist at various Parish wide functions. Activities may include cooking, setting up, cleaning up and other "duties" as needed. The Committee is responsible for organizing and running our Parish Feast Day Celebration, Trick or Trunk and the Fall Festival. The Committee is also available to assist any other Ministry's activities if needed. Volunteers would not be obligated to assist with all activities. This is an excellent opportunity to use some of the talent and time that our Lord has graciously bestowed upon us.

Parish Social Life

50+ Club: This is a spiritual/social group that meets monthly on the first Friday of the month to enjoy one another's company and to attend the First Friday Liturgy together. From time to time, programs are presented with topics of interest and occasional bus trips are planned.

Funeral Support Ministry provides support to a family who has been affected by the loss of one of its members. We provide a funeral luncheon, if requested by the family, which offers an opportunity to get together after the funeral Mass or Burial in the Parish Social Hall. Volunteers purchase or prepare food items on an on call basis that is rotated so that your services are only occasionally needed.

Knights of Columbus #8857: God, family, community—these are the priorities of the Knights of Columbus. The Knights and their families act on these priorities continually throughout the year to make a difference on our Church, community and world. The Knights meet on the first Thursday of each month.

Parish Pastoral Council is a group of parishioners who volunteer their time by being elected for a period of 2 years. The Council meets on the 4th Thursday of each month. Elections are held during Advent of the election year. The purpose of the Council is to help the Pastor envision present and future plans for the Parish, to make suggestions/recommendations that he will take under advisement, to facilitate communication between the Pastor and parishioners. They also support the financial, social, ministerial and spiritual aspects of the Parish Community.

Bulletin Inserters are volunteers who assist the office staff by "inserting" the weekly bulletin with informative inserts. They will be called upon to help every few months for one hour on a Friday. They may also help with large mailings, etc.

Catholic Mother's of PreSchoolers are mothers of children from ages 0-5 who come together to socialize and have the children play together. Join us on Thursday mornings after 9:00am Mass in the nursery.

Pre-School Mom's

Nursery: This ministry provides childcare for children less than 3 years of age during the Masses. It also provides care for children, up to age 10 during various Faith Formation times and other Catholic related functions.
