What is an Active Membership: three points determine active membership: Registration in the parish for a sufficient period of time and use of the envelope system in support of the parish; Faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; Volunteer and participate in Parish activities with time, talent, and treasure as means permit.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Meet Our Pastor, Father Arul

Fr. Arulanantham (Arul) Yagappan, MSFS, was born on May 13, 1970 as the sixth child and the last son of Mr. & Mrs. Yagappan in Trichy, Tamilnadu, India.



He wanted to become a missionary, after graduation from high school, so he joined the religious congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales (MSFS) and was ordained to priesthood on January 27, 1997. He obtained a Bachelor Degree of Education from Bundelkhand University, U.P, and a Master of Arts from Osmania University, Hyderabad, India.

As a missionary priest he served in different parts of Andrapredesh (A.P) and Tamilnadu as Vice Principal of a school and Director of the Home for the Aged for 10 years in India. In 2005, he was called to serve in the island of St. Lucia, West Indies as a pastor. Then in October 2013, he was called to serve in the Diocese of St. Augustine, Florida assigned to St. Paul Catholic Church, Jacksonville Beach. In March 2016, he became an interim administrator at St. Paul Catholic Church, River Side, Jacksonville. In June 2016 he was assigned as Parochial Vicar at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church. Then he was assigned as Parochial Vicar of St. John the Evangelist parish, Chiefland, Florida until he joined Good Shepherd in Hope Mills in June of 2021.

Good Shepherd Parish is blessed to have Father Arul join our family community and formally installed Sunday, January 23, 2022 by Bishop Luis Zarama.

DID YOU KNOW?

Monday, January 31 is the memorial of St. John Bosco.

John Bosco was born in the archdiocese of Turin, Italy, in 1815. His father died when John he was two years old. Although they struggled financially, his mother raised and provided him with a good humanistic, Christian education. At the age of twenty he entered the major seminary, assisted financially by Fr. Guala, founder of the ecclesiastical residence St. Francis of Assisi in Turin. John Bosco was ordained a priest June 5, 1846, and founded the oratory of St. Francis de Sales. At that time Turin was on the threshold of the industrial revolution, and faced many challenges/ problems, especially for young men. A gifted educator and leader, Don Bosco formulated a system of education based on **"reason, religion and kindness."**

In spite of the criticism & attacks of anti-clerics, he held workshops for manual laborers, schools of arts & sciences for young workers, and schools of liberal arts for preparation of the priesthood. In 1868 there were 800 students involved in this educational system. To ensure the continuation of his work, Don Bosco founded the Society of St. Francis de Sales (**Salesians**) in 1869. With the help of Sister Mary Dominic Mazzarello, he founded the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Auxiliatrix. In 1875 a wave of emigration to Latin America prompted the inauguration of the Salesian Missionary Apostolate. He also wrote the Salesian Bulletin & popular catechetical pamphlets distributed throughout Italy.

This great apostle and catechist of youth died on January 31, 1888. He was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1934. Pope John Paul II named him "teacher and father to the young." St. John Bosco is the Patron Saint of: boys, and young people, Mexican young people, laborers, schoolchildren; students and editors. —Reference: Excerpted from *Saints of the Roman Calendar* by Enzo Lodi

Prayer for the 2023 Synod Process:

Adsumus Sancte Spiritu - (We Stand Before You)

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the bishops and Holy Father praying this prayer. Adsumus Sancte Spiritus, the first word of the Latin Original meaning, "We stand before You, Holy Spirit" which has been historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gather for hundreds of years. This prayer is attributed to St. Isidore of Seville (c.560- April 4, 636). To embrace this 2021-2023 Synod, the Holy Father is proposing that the entire of God pray this simplified version of the Adsumus, so that we may be a community and a people of grace. Those who are homebound, please pray this prayer weekly.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

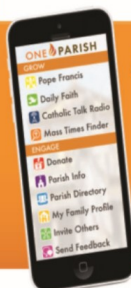
