

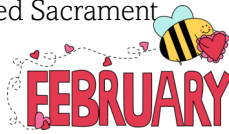

DID YOU KNOW? Our Lady of Lourdes

On February 11th we celebrate the Blessed Mother's appearance to Bernadette Soubirous which took place in 1858, Lourdes, France.

St. Bernadette described the lady wearing a white robe encircled by a blue girdle (sash) and a white veil. She held a rosary in her hand and there was a yellow rose on each foot. During the apparition on March 25, the lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception." During one of the 18 apparitions Our Lady asked Bernadette to wash and drink from the spring (which was at that time unseen). Obediently Bernadette dug to uncover a small spring.

Since then, millions have imbibed and bathed in the water of Lourdes. Lourdes has become a place of pilgrimage and healing, but even more of faith. Church authorities have recognized over 60 miraculous cures, although there have probably been many more. To people of faith this is not surprising. The waters from the spring have been studied and found to have no special or unusual properties, it is pure and potable. Faith is the 'secret' ingredient. As Bernadette said, "One must have faith and pray; the water will have no virtue without faith."

At 22, St. Bernadette joined the Sisters of Charity of Nevers. With a silent and good nature she suffered greatly throughout her life from asthma, and finally while in the convent from tuberculosis of the knee bone. Despite her agony, St. Bernadette declined the opportunity to return to Lourdes and or drink again from the spring. When asked why she would not take the water she responded "Our Lady's promised me happiness not in this world, but in the next."

The main message of Our Lady for Bernadette to share with us was **"Penance! Penance! Penance! Pray to God for sinners."** This is a continuation of Jesus' healing miracles—now performed at the intercession of his mother. Lourdes is a special place in the hearts of many popes. St. Pope John Paul II made three pilgrimages to Lourdes. He also proclaimed February 11, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, as World Day of the Sick. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in his Angelus address on the first Sunday of Lent in 2008 – the 150th anniversary of Our Lady's first appearance at Lourdes – reminded us of its enduring significance, "The message that Our Lady continues to spread in Lourdes recalls the words that Jesus spoke at the very beginning of his public mission, which we hear several times during these days of Lent: 'Repent, and believe in the Gospel,' pray and do penance."

Several authors wrote about St. Bernadette, one famous book / movie is "The Song of Bernadette", written by Franz Werfel, a Jewish German who took refuge from the Nazi's in Lourdes, France during WWII. Told of the apparitions of Our Lady by the families who protected them during this time of peri Franz vowed that if they should survive, he would write the story of St. Bernadette. His first task when arriving in the United States was to write *"The Song of Bernadette"*.

It is important to know St. Bernadette had minimal schooling and minimal catechesis due to illness and the need for her help with siblings at home. She was raised in a family whose cherished the faith, formed through a strong "domestic Church". We can see there was profound understanding in Bernadette's heart as she later wrote, **"I was nothing, and of this nothing God made something great. 'In Holy Communion I am heart to heart with Jesus. How sublime is my destiny.'"**

Is this not true for each and every one of us when with love, understanding and reverence we partake Holy Communion?

Meet Our Pastor, Father Arul

Fr. Arulanantham (Arul) Yagappan, MSFS, was born on May 13, 1970 as the sixth child and the last son of Mr. & Mrs. Yagappan in Trichy, Tamilnadu, India. He wanted to become a missionary, after graduation from high school, so he joined the religious congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales (MSFS) and was ordained to priesthood on January 27, 1997. He obtained a Bachelor Degree of Education from Bundelkhand University, U.P, and a Master of Arts from Osmania University, Hyderabad, India. As a missionary priest he served in different parts of Andrapredesh (A.P) and Tamilnadu as Vice Principal of a

school and Director of the Home for the Aged for 10 years in India. In 2005, he was called to serve in the island of St. Lucia, West Indies as a pastor. Then in October 2013, he was called to serve in the Diocese of St. Augustine, Florida assigned to St. Paul Catholic Church, Jacksonville Beach. In March 2016, he became an interim administrator at St. Paul Catholic Church, River Side, Jacksonville. In June 2016 he was assigned as Parochial Vicar at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church. Then he was assigned as Parochial Vicar of St. John the Evangelist parish, Chiefland, Florida until he joined Good Shepherd in Hope Mills in June of 2021.

Prayer for the 2023 Synod Process:

Adsumus Sancte Spiritu - (We Stand Before You)

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the bishops and Holy Father praying this prayer. Adsumus Sancte Spiritus, the first word of the Latin Original meaning, "We stand before You, Holy Spirit" which has been historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gather for hundreds of years. This prayer is attributed to St. Isidore of Seville (c.560- April 4, 636). To embrace this 2021-2023 Synod, the Holy Father is proposing that the entire of God pray this simplified version of the Adsumus, so that we may be a community and a people of grace. Those who are homebound, please pray this prayer weekly.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

St. Scholastica, Feast Day: February 10

Twins often share the same interests and ideas with an equal intensity. Therefore, it is no surprise that Scholastica and her twin brother, Benedict, established religious communities within a few miles from each other. The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters. According to the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great, the brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day. He refused her request because he did not want to spend a night outside the monastery, thus breaking his own Rule. Scholastica asked God to let her brother remain and a severe thunderstorm broke out, preventing Benedict and his monks from returning to the abbey. Benedict cried out, "God forgive you, Sister. What have you done?" Scholastica replied, "I asked a favor of you and you refused. I asked it of God and he granted it." Brother and sister parted the next morning after their long discussion. Three days later, Benedict was praying in his monastery and saw the soul of his sister rising heavenward in the form of a white dove. Benedict then announced the death of his sister to the monks and later buried her in the tomb he had prepared for himself.

From the Diocese of Raleigh

On January 30, 2022, the beginning of Catholic Schools Week, the 2022-2023 application for the African American and Native American Ancestry Tuition Assistance will be available. Catholic school students (K-12th grade) of African American and Native American Ancestry in the Diocese of Raleigh are eligible to apply for tuition assistance. The assistance awards come from funds granted to the diocese from the Black and Indian Mission Office founded by the Catholic bishops of the United States. All applicants MUST complete a Catholic school enrollment application and a FACTS tuition eligibility application before this application will be considered. Application deadline: March 11, 2022. Decision letters will be mailed to parents no later than May 23, 2022. Tuition awards are sent from the diocese to the applicant's school. Application opens on January 30, 2022, and closes on March 11, 2022. Apply at <https://raldioc.configio.com/tuition-assistance>.

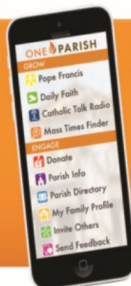
