



How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically or mentally ill**, including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as diabase. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.


For more than twenty-five years, Project Rachel of Central and Eastern North Carolina has served those who




