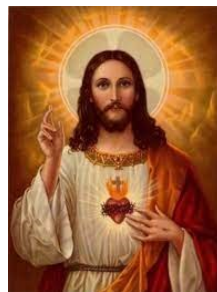

Please collect one non-perishable food item per day and bring your donations to the Church each weekend so the items can be distributed **during Lent**. ~ Items needed for the **food pantries** include spaghetti, pasta sauce, macaroni and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, rice, cereal, oatmeal, canned meats, vegetables, fruit, and tuna. ~ Items needed for **KAP (Kids Assistance Program)** include: gallon zip-lock freezer bags, tall kitchen garbage bags, plastic spoons, bottled water, single serve boxes of cereal, fruit snacks, individual 100% juice boxes, individual size shelf staple milk, pack of Cheese & Crackers (Please No Peanut Butter), "instant lunch" (in cup) Ramen Noodles w/ vegetables, beef jerky sticks, and Chef Boyardee microwaveable pastas.

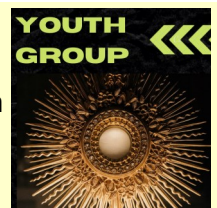


ATTENTION ALL YOUTH

Fasting & Abstinence

NORMS FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, **February 22**, and Good Friday, **April 7**, are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law requires no obligation. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The Church Faithful and Catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Renewal of Baptismal Promises or Initiation into the Church at Easter.

40 Days for Life Spring

40 Days for Life is a focused pro-life campaign with a vision to access God's power through prayer, fasting, and peaceful vigil to end abortion.

During these 40 days, we ask for volunteers to stand and pray at the abortion center, and also to fast. Christ told us some demons can only be driven out by prayer and fasting. The two go hand in hand. Prayer keeps us rooted in the fact that it is our desire to carry out God's will. Fasting is a sacrifice that helps us reach beyond our own limitations with God's help.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

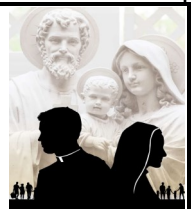

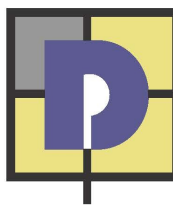
