

During her apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to Lucia, "I shall come to ask...that on the first Saturday of every month, communions of reparation be made at one moment for the sins of the world. Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces



necessary for salvation, all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the first Saturday for five successive months - go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the twenty mysteries of the Rosary."

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threating ailment, ask to be anointed. If you would like to be anointed, contact the Office.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our Catholic Faith calls us to use Faith and Reason. A notable Catholic, Nicolaus Copernicus born in Poland on February 19, 1473 was one such person.

His entire family were members of the Third Order of St. Dominic. When he was nearly 10 years old his father died, he was provided university education by his uncle. Eventually he became a member of the clergy at Frauenburg Cathedral. Copernicus believed that God designed and created the universe. He further believed that God's design was mathematical with the everywhere appearing symmetry of nature supporting this belief. Both Martin Luther and the Catholic hierarchy condemned his theory of a "heliocentric" concept of the solar system, which later became the foundation for modern astronomy (his revolutionary book was banned until 1758). This opposition however did not hinder him from remaining a faithful member of the Roman Catholic Church. Copernicus died 24 May, 1543 and is quoted as writing: It is our loving duty to seek the truth in all things, in so far as God has granted that to human reason." (issue 76: Christian Face of the Scientific Revolution). Copernicus, is not recognized as a Saint but is remembered as a loyal Catholic priest who applied both Faith and reason to his life and studies.

The Lenten Season begins Wednesday, March 2, just a little over a week from this Sunday. Our children and youth will be asked to participate in our annual Lenten Almsgiving for CRS (Catholic Relief Services)Rice Bowls. Individual rice bowls will be given out in class next Sunday, February 27 to have at home for the beginning of Lent. TUITION ASSISTANCE FROM DIOCESE OF RALEIGH

On January 30, 2022, the beginning of Catholic Schools Week, the 2022-2023 application for the African American and Native American Ancestry Tuition Assistance will be available. Catholic school students (K-12th grade) of African American and Native American Ancestry in the Diocese of Raleigh are eligible to apply for tuition assistance.

The assistance awards come from funds granted to the diocese from the Black and Indian Mission Office founded by the Catholic bishops of the United States. All applicants MUST complete a Catholic school enrollment application and a FACTS tuition eligibility application before this application will be considered. Application deadline: March 11, 2022. Decision letters will be mailed to parents no later than May 23, 2022. Tuition awards are sent from the diocese to the applicant's school. Application opens on January 30, 2022, and closes on March 11, 2022. Apply at https://raldioc.configio.com/tuition-assistance.

What is an Active Membership: Registration in the parish for a sufficient period of time and use of the envelope system in support of the parish; Faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; Volunteer and participate in Parish activities with time, talent, and treasure as means permit.

Please note the Facilities and Services of Good Shepherd Church are available to active members.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.



Fasting and Abstinence

All Fridays in Lent are days of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. Abstinence is refraining from eating meat.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.


