

DID YOU KNOW

Lenten practices were formalized in the Catholic Church at the First Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten Season of 40 days. The number "40" (as do some other numbers) has a spiritual significance in regard to preparation: Moses stayed on Mount Sinai 40 days and 40 nights without eating or drinking water in preparation to receive the Ten Commandments, Elijah walked 40 days and nights to Mount Sinai, the mountain of the Lord, and most importantly, Jesus fasted and prayed for 40 days and 40 nights in the dessert in preparation for His public ministry. Next week we will look at Lenten rules for fasting and modifications that took place over the centuries.

LENTEN REFLECTIONS


To help us prepare for Easter we will post a weekly reflection from St. Augustine of Hippo. St Augustine was a 5th century Bishop of Hippo, located in Numidia, North Africa. He is recognized as one of the early Church Fathers, and a Doctor of the Church for his inexhaustible spiritual insights and writings to early Christian communities. His many works include City of God, On Christian Doctrine and Confessions. Reflection: Our wound is serious, but the Physician is all powerful. Does it seem to you so small a mercy that, while you were living in evil and sinning, He did not take away your life, but brought you to belief and forgave your sins? What I suffer is serious, but I trust the Almighty. I would despair of my mortal wound if I had not found so great a Physician. (Sermon 352,3) **Prayer**: Bring relief to a serious wound with Your great medicine. Mine is serious, but I take refuge in the Almighty. (Commentary on Psalm 50.6)

BURNING OF THE PALMS

This past Sunday children and youth learned about the meaning of Ash Wednesday and Lent. Middle School Youth then took part in preparing blessed palms from 2021 Palm Sunday to be burned for the ashes that were used for Ash Wednesday. Youth took part in a prayer service with Fr. Arul and Mr. Jim assisted with the burning of the Palms.







Fasting and Abstinence

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. Abstinence is refraining from eating meat.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.

Lenten Penance Services

When a number of penitents assemble at the same time to receive sacramental absolution, it is fitting that they be prepared for the sacrament by a celebration of the word of God. Those who will receive the sacrament at another time may also take part in the service. Communal celebration shows more clearly the ecclesial nature of penance. The faithful listen together to the word of God, which proclaims his mercy and invites them to conversion; at the same time they examine the conformity of their lives with that word of God and help each other through common prayer.

40 CANS 4 LENT

The Knights of Columbus is once again sponsoring this Lenten opportunity to help stock



the food pantries of Good Shepherd, the Alms House, and Catholic Charities, assist the Kids Assistance Program (KAP), and the Women of Charity Easter Basket project. Participants are asked to donate one non-perishable food item per day and to bring their donations to the Church each weekend so the items can be distributed during Lent to the various food pantries, and to KAP.

Items needed for the food pantries include: spaghetti, pasta sauce, macaroni and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, rice, cereal, oatmeal, canned meats, vegetables, fruit, and tuna. Items needed for KAP include: gallon zip-lock freezer bags, tall kitchen garbage bags, plastic spoons, bottled water, single serve boxes of cereal, fruit snacks, individual 100% juice boxes, individual size shelf stable milk, pack of Cheese & Crackers (Please No Peanut Butter), Ramen Noodles, beef jerky sticks, and Chef Boyardee microwavable pastas.

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threating ailment, ask to be anointed. If you would like to be anointed, contact the Office.

Volunteer Opportunities

Good Shepherd is in need of your time and talent in maintaining our Parish. These acts of service are an excellent way to sacrifice for



our Lord, especially during the Lenten Season.

Garden Committee: A committee is forming to help with the beauty of the grounds around the Parish. If you are interested in volunteering for the Garden Committee, sign up on the Welcome Table in the Gathering Area.

Food Pantry Help: Volunteers needed to maintain our Food Pantry. Responsibilities would include: discarding any out of date food, organizing shelf when


