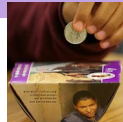
SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

40 CANS 4 LENT

Easter Sunday will conclude our 40 Cans 4 Lent Project. Your generous donations have helped quell hunger pains of those less fortunate in our Community. Items needed for the food pantries include: spaghetti, pasta sauce, macaroni and cheese, peanut butter, jelly, rice, cereal, oatmeal, canned meats, vegetables, fruit, and tuna. Items needed for KAP include: gallon zip-lock freezer bags, tall kitchen garbage bags, plastic spoons, bottled water, single serve boxes of cereal, fruit snacks, individual 100% juice drinks, individual size carton shelf stable milk, pack of Cheese Crackers (Please No Peanut Butter), Ramen Noodles, beef jerky sticks, and Chef Boyardee microwavable pastas. Boxes are located in the Gathering Area by the Share Table and at the Entrances to the Church and Social Hall.

DID YOU KNOW

This Sunday, Palm Sunday - the final Sunday of Lent commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, when branches of palms were laid down upon the path He took just days before His arrest on Holy Thursday and His crucifixion on Good Friday. This Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week - final week of Lent, the colors of the Mass are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful receive palms to remember and participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival into Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the of the townspeople who threw clothes and palms or small branches in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice showing great respect of the people. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

On Palm Sunday palms are distributed to parishioners and blessed. Many people fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion.

Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.

LENTEN REFLECTIONS

Let them deny themselves, that is, not put their trust in themselves. Let them take up their cross, that is, put up with all the affronts of the world for the love of Christ.

Persist, persevere, endure bear up under the delay. In this way you will bear your cross. (Sermon 96,9)

PRAYER: Christ, Son of God, if you had not wished to suffer, You would not have suffered.

Show us the fruit of Your passion.

Fasting and Abstinence

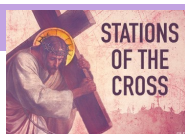
Good Friday is a day of Fasting AND Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.

Stations of the Cross

The Outdoor Stations of the Cross will be prayed following the Good Friday Service. They will be lead by the Women of Charity. There will not be a Soup Dinner on Good Friday.

Divine Mercy Novena



In the Diary of St. Faustina, Jesus asked that the Feast of Divine Mercy, known today as Divine Mercy Sunday, be preceded by a Novena to The Divine Mercy. The Novena is nine days of prayer in preparation for the Feast Day.

For the Novena to The Divine Mercy, we pray the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy each day for a specific intention. Our Lord told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).

Please join us as we begin the Novena of Divine Mercy on Good Friday, April 15th following the 3:00p.m. Service and Stations of the Cross. ALL ARE WELCOME. We will continue the Novena privately, conclude on Saturday April 23rd and come together to celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 24th.

Jesus wanted each day of the Novena to have a specific intention as listed below. For more information about the Divine Mercy Novena, visit thedivinemercy.org

Day 1: Today bring to Me ALL MANKIND, ESPECIALLY ALL SINNERS, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 2: Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF PRIESTS AND RELIGIOUS, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy. It was they who gave Me strength to endure My bitter Passion.

Day 3: Today bring to Me ALL DEVOUT AND FAITHFUL SOULS, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy. The souls brought Me consolation on the Way of the Cross.

Day 4: Today bring to Me The PAGANS AND THOSE WHO DO NOT YET KNOW ME. I was thinking also of them during My bitter Passion, and their future zeal comforted My Heart. Immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 5: Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF THOSE WHO HAVE SEPARATED THEMSELVES FROM MY CHURCH, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy. During My bitter Passion they tore at My Body and Heart, that is, My Church.

Day 6: Today bring to Me THE MEEK AND HUMBLE SOULS AND THE SOULS OF LITTLE CHILDREN, and immerse them in My mercy. These souls most closely resemble My Heart. They strengthened Me during My bitter agony.

Day 7: Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ESPECIALLY VENERATE AND GLORIFY MY MERCY, and immerse them in My mercy. These souls sorrowed most over my Passion and entered most deeply into My spirit.

Day 8: Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ARE DETAINED IN PURGATORY, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. Let the torrents of My Blood cool down their scorching flames.

Day 9: Today bring to Me SOULS WHO HAVE BECOME LUKEWARM, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy. These souls wound My Heart most painfully.

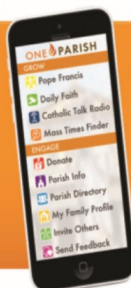
