PREPARING FOR THE 2025 JUBILEE YEAR

Pope Francis will lead the Church in celebrating a Jubilee Year in 2025 and has asked us to begin preparing for this holy year by learning about Vatican II <u>this</u> year and focusing on Prayer <u>next</u> year,

2024. In response to his request, a class on the four major documents of Vatican II will be offered this summer which will also look at the reasons why the Council was held. In addition, the group will look at what changes were called for, as well as the continuity of Church teaching that is contained in the documents.

Two registration sheets are located on the Welcome Table in the Gathering Area. There will be two class schedule options: Sunday mornings between the Masses, and Monday evenings. There is no charge for this class, which Jan Carnahan will facilitate.

COMMENTS ON VATICAN II

The Introduction to the Vatican II Documents by Lawrence Cardinal Shehan, Archbishop of Baltimore, January 25, 1966 begins, "It was a sense of continuity which inspired the saying, 'The king is dead; long live the king.' A similar sense would justify the statement, 'The Council is over; the Council has just begun.'

The Council is indeed over. John XXIII had been Pope for merely ninety days when, on January 25, 1959, he made the first and completely unexpected announcement of his plan to convoke the Church's Twenty-First Ecumenical Council, the first since Vatican I of 1869-70. On October 11, 1962, after nearly four years of exhaustive preparation, the Council finally opened.

In a positive and optimistic speech, the eighty-yearold Pope John gently chided the prophets of doom within the Church and spoke of the world's need for the medicine of mercy. Thus, less than nine months before his death, he set the pastoral tone which was to dominate the Council deliberations. (p. xv)"

Why did Pope John XXIII think the Church could provide "the medicine of mercy" the world needs?

Special Feast Days of the Church



Ascension of the Lord Sunday—May 21: Christ's Ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain

Pentecost Sunday—May 28: The Holy Spirit, whom Christ the head pours out on his members, builds, animates, and sanctifies the Church. *The tradition is to wear red this Sunday.*





The Most Holy Trinity—June 4: The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself.

<u>Corpus Christi</u>—June 11: The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. This day reminds us that we partake of Jesus in the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.





The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus—June 16: Within the sacred heart of Jesus, pierced for love of humankind, is contained the full depth of the divine treasures of love and mercy, grace and salvation.

Other Special Days in the Church



Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church—May 29: Mary gave birth to Christ, the Head of the Church, and became Mother of the Church, his Mystical Body.

Feast of Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary—May 31: Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth, bringing Christ to her and John the Baptist. They recognize Jesus as cause of our joy. We are also called to bring Jesus to others.



Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary—



June 17: It was through Mary's Immaculate Heart, a gift from God, that the Sacred Heart of Jesus was made manifest. The love of her heart is to be a model for the way we should love God.

Solemnity of Nativity of Saint John the

Baptist—June 24: St. John the Baptist is our model for living a good Christian life and fulfilling our baptismal vows. We must evangelize, sharing the good news of our salvation through Jesus Christ. We must decrease, so *HE* will increase.



Solemnity of Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles—June 29:



Holy Mother Church was built upon the rock of Peter, to whom Jesus gave the keys of his kingdom on earth. St. Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, labored to bring all peoples to Christ through His Church. Both saints were martyred in Rome.

Liturgical Ministries

<u>Sacristans</u> are responsible for setting the Altar and see to the care of the various candles located in the Sanctuary. They are also responsible for ensuring everything is in order for the celebration of Mass, allowing the Celebrant to concentrate solely on the liturgy.

"The sacristan diligently arranges the liturgical books, the vestments, and other things that are necessary for the celebration of Mass." *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), #105(a)* The term Sacristan comes from the Latin word, sacer, which means sacred. Sacristans are often behind the scenes as prayerful ministers that bring to mind the words of Jesus when He said we should not do good works just to gain rewards (Matthew 6:1).

Lectors nourish the Faith of the community by proclaiming the Word of God in an audible and intelligible manner to the community.

"The lector is instituted to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture, with the exception of the Gospel. He may also announce the intentions for the Prayer of the Faithful and, in the absence of a psalmist, proclaim the Psalm between the readings." *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), #99)* On Word of God Sunday, January 2022, Pope Francis said of the Office of Lector, "They are called to the important work of serving the Gospel of Jesus, of proclaiming him, so that his consolation, his joy and his liberation can reach everyone."

<u>Altar Servers</u> carry the cross, the processional candles, hold the book for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar, carry the incense and censer, present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people, wash the hands of the priest, assist the priest celebrant and deacon.

"In the earthly liturgy we take part in a foretaste of that heavenly liturgy which is celebrated in the holy city of Jerusalem toward which we journey as pilgrims, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God, a minister of the holies and of the true tabernacle." *SACROSANCTUM CONCILIUM, Ch. 1, §1, #8*)

Serving on the Altar is a very special way to serve our Lord. In May 2021, Pope Francis gave this message to Altar Servers: "Animated by respect and interior recollection, your service as an altar server will become a Profession of Faith for the community. Offer Jesus your hands, your thoughts and your time, and He will not fail to reward you, giving you true joy and making you feel where the most complete happiness is."






