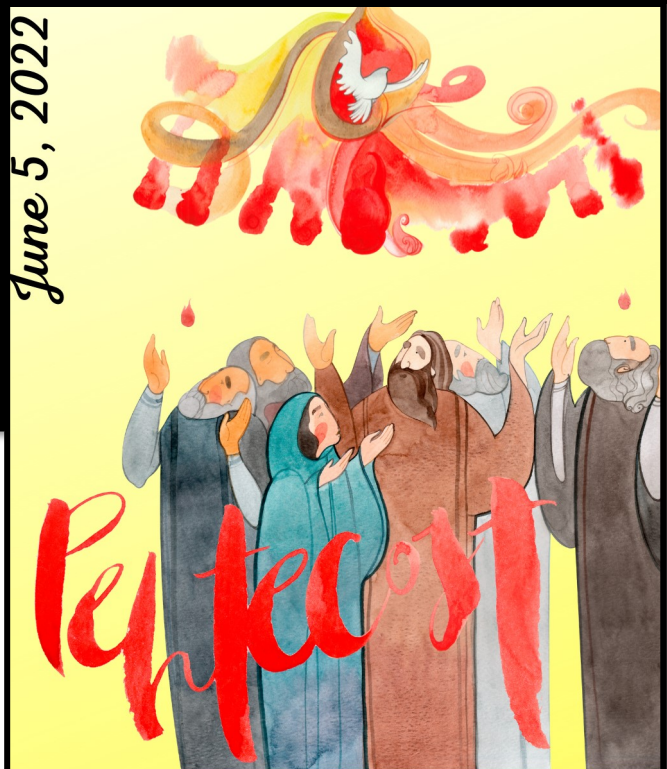

Registration is a sign of one's commitment and responsibility to the parish and allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your active membership and is essential for participation in parish programs and sacraments. **\*Please return Registration Forms to the Office\***

**Baptisms:** Planning to have your child baptized? Baptismal Preparation classes are required for Baptisms within the Diocese of Raleigh. Parents need to attend session BEFORE scheduling the baptism of their child. Godparents must attend either at Good Shepherd, or their own parish, which should provide proof of attendance. Prep Session is the first Saturday of the month.

**Marriage Prep:** The Diocese of Raleigh requires a six month preparation period for couples with the pastor to be married in the Church. Contact the Office to schedule.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Available upon request, contact the Office to schedule. For Emergencies, contact the pastor at (862)283-0194.

**Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized:** Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

**Funerals:** For funeral arrangements, contact the Office.

**Special Needs:** Handicapped accessible doors are located on the left side of the Gathering Area. Wheelchair seating is available in the front row of chairs in the Church. Cars must display valid handicap sticker or placard to park in the reserved handicap spaces in the Church parking lot.

**Angels' Haven:** We invite all families with children under 4 years of age to take advantage of our **Angel's Haven**, when necessary. This room was created to help families with young ones still participate in Mass.

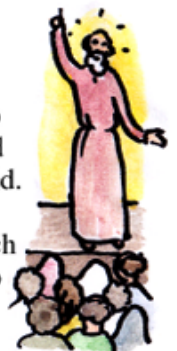


Did you know that Pentecost Sunday is the Church's birthday? Not the church building, but the people who are the Church.

You can pray that God will send you the Holy Spirit every day. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that God will give the Holy Spirit to whoever asks.



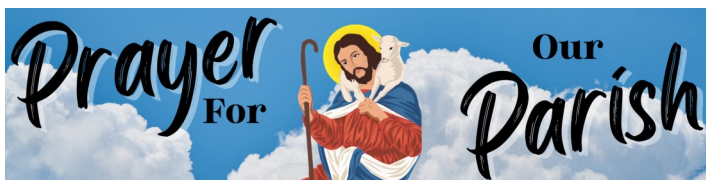
## FAITH FORMATION FOR ADULTS AND CHILDREN OVER 7

## **The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church: June 6**

The Feast Day of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church was established in 2018 by Pope Francis to be celebrated every year upon the Monday following Pentecost. In this way, the Church specifically recalls Mary's reception of the Holy Spirit with the Apostles at Pentecost, as well as her desire to protect all who come to her Son in His Holy Church. The many mysteries of Jesus' life that Mary pondered were brought to full understanding in her heart at Pentecost. As the Church was fully established in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, strengthening the Lord's followers to believe in and to proclaim the Gospel, the Blessed Mother was there as the foremost example of what it means to fully say yes to Jesus.

## **The Most Holy Trinity: June 12**

The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. But I submit humbly and say: Lord, I believe, help my weak faith.

## **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 19**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ."

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist.

## **The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: June 25**

The promises of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. He promised that, in response to those who consecrate themselves and make reparations to His Sacred Heart, that: He will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life. He will establish peace in their homes. He will comfort them in all their afflictions. He will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death. He will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings. Sinners will find in His Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection. He will bless every place in which an image of His Heart is exposed and honored. He will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in His Heart. In the excessive mercy of His Heart that His all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in His disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. His divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

Last weekend we were blessed to have a visiting priest from Cross Catholic Outreach. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. *If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threatening ailment, ask to be anointed.* If you would like to be anointed, contact the Office.

## **Prayer for the Sick**

Dear Jesus, Divine Physician and Healer of the sick, we turn to you in this time of illness. O dearest comforter of the troubled, alleviate our worry and sorrow with your gentle love, and grant us the grace and strength to accept this burden. Dear God, we place our worries in your hands. We place our sick under your care and humbly ask that you restore your servant to health again. Above all, grant us the grace to acknowledge your will and know that whatever you do, you do for the love of us. Amen.

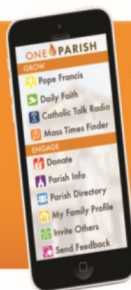
