
Marriage: Couples are asked not to set a date for their wedding until an initial meeting with the Pastor.



We can help!

The **Inquiry Period of the OCIA** is designed to answer questions of those who have shown an interest in the Catholic Church but are not ready to make a commitment to join. The catechists are friendly and knowledgeable and do

not pressure anyone to join the Church. Some of the usual questions are answered, such as: Why do Catholics confess their sins to a priest? Do Catholics worship Mary? What is the Mass? What do Catholics believe about communion? Why does the Church have a pope? And more! Unique individual questions are also answered. At the end of the period, those who wish to continue are welcomed into the Catechumenate so they can learn more and decide if they want to become Catholic. If you offer to accompany your relative or friend to the first

session, it could make that person feel more comfortable.

Inquiry sessions will begin next Sunday, July 9, 9:45-11:15am in the Library located in the Administrative wing of the church.



First Friday Devotion for Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Our Lord said to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, "I promise you, in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving the sacraments; my divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in that last moment."

Requirements of this Devotion:

- 1. The devotion is practiced for *nine* consecutive First Fridays of the month
- Confession (sometime within a week before or after the First Friday) -(Recommended to ensure proper state of grace)
- 3. Holy Communion
- 4. Done with the intent and spirit for reparation for offenses against the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Why Nine First Fridays?

The number nine is traditionally associated with a novena and finds its origin in the nine days that the apostles spent in prayer before Pentecost. A novena provides an extended amount of time for preparation and interior renewal.

The Reason for this Devotion:

The devotion is offered in reparation for sinners who commit offenses against the Sacred Heart of Jesus. These offenses are listed in the Act of Reparation Prayer made to the Sacred Heart. Jesus told Saint Margaret Mary that he wanted to spread the love of his heart through her and that she would reveal to many people the grace he desires always to bestow on humanity. In her vision, Margaret Mary saw Jesus take her heart and place it within his, setting it aflame with divine love that continued to burn in her heart as it returned to her body.

What does devotion to the Sacred Heart mean? Christ described his heart, according to Margaret Mary, as "the heart that has so loved humanity that it has spared nothing, even exhausting and consuming itself in testimony of its love." Thus, the Sacred Heart represents the fullness of God's love for humanity and the overflowing generosity of Christ's gift of self in the act of salvation.

Here at Good Shepherd, we celebrate the First Friday Devotion every month. Please join us!

Also join us for our First Saturday Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the first Saturday of every month throughout the year.


