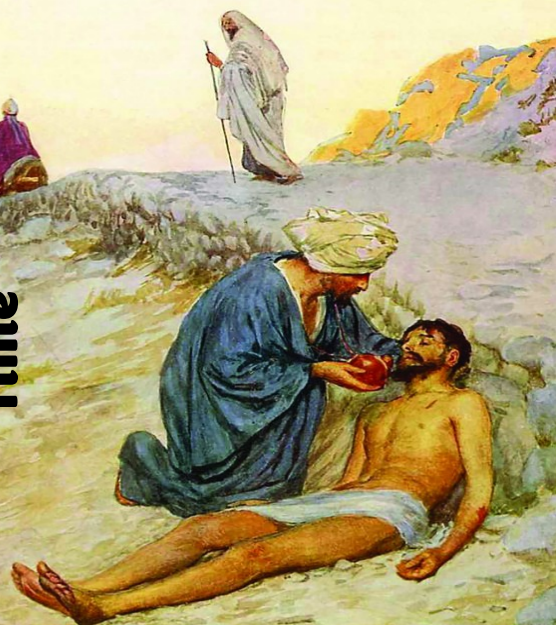

Welcome to Good Shepherd

New Parishioners: We invite you to register at the Church Office during office hours, pickup a Welcome Packet in the Gathering Area or online at www.good-shepherd-church.org. Registration is a sign of one's commitment and responsibility to the parish and allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your active membership and is essential for participation in parish programs and sacraments. ***Please return Registration Forms to the Office***

Baptisms: Planning to have your child baptized? Baptismal Preparation classes are required for Baptisms within the Diocese of Raleigh. Parents need to attend session BEFORE scheduling the baptism of their child. Godparents must attend either at Good Shepherd, or their own parish, which should provide proof of attendance. Baptismal Preparation Class is the first Saturday of the month.

Marriage Prep: The Diocese of Raleigh requires a six month preparation period for couples with the pastor to be married in the Church. Contact the Office to schedule.

Anointing of the Sick: Available upon request, contact the Office to schedule. For Emergencies, contact the pastor at (862)283-0194.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Funerals: For funeral arrangements, contact the Office.

Special Needs: Handicapped accessible doors are located on the left side of the Gathering Area. Wheelchair seating is available in the front row of chairs in the Church. Cars must display valid handicap sticker or placard to park in the reserved handicap spaces in the Church parking lot.

Angels' Haven: We invite all families with children under 4 years of age to take advantage of our **Angel's Haven**, when necessary. This room was created to help families with young ones still participate in Mass.

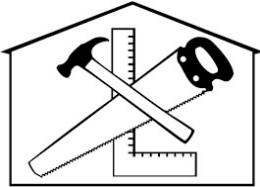

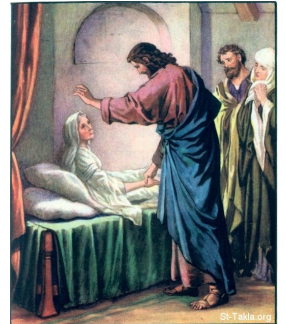

All Praise and Honor be given to God for the overturning of Roe v. Wade. Prayers have been answered but the fight is not over. Write to your elected officials, get the laws in North Carolina changed and when the time comes, vote in Pro-Life candidates.

Spiritual Adoption

Please do not forget your Spiritual Adoption little ones. Since Ash Wednesday and continuing to November 23, the Pro-Life Ministry asks you to join them in praying for the babies in danger of being aborted by praying the following prayer daily: "Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of [baby's name] the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion." The Pro-Life Ministry have named their babies Amelia Grace and Joseph Anthony, but you may name your baby as you would like.

At 18 weeks, your baby is the size of an artichoke. Your baby looks much more human now. Your baby may be large enough now or anytime in the next few weeks for you to feel twisting, rolling, kicking and punching in the womb. The art of the yawn has been mastered by your baby, along with hiccupping, which you may feel soon, too!
