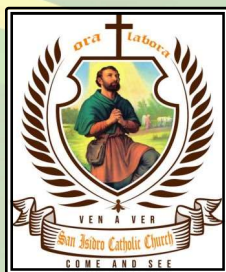

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

Pope Francis has announced the creation of a new international day to honor grandparents and the elderly, which will take place this year on July 25. The World Day for the Grandparents and the Elderly will be held annually on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of the grandparents of Jesus, Saints Joachim and Anne.

"The Holy Spirit ... arouses thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly today: their voice is precious because it sings the praises of God and guards the roots of peoples. They remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between generations, to transmit to young people an experience of life and faith," Pope Francis said in the library of the Vatican's Apostolic Palace Jan. 31.

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

Faith Formation Registration

FAITH FORMATION SESSIONS FOR 2021-2022

Registration is open, youth will be accepted into sessions according to prior attendance and first register - first placement.

Early registration during the month of August is helpful to insure the right number of books and supplies for our children and youth in each level.

Please keep in mind that 2 full years of faith formation is necessary for reception of the Sacrament of First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation. Sessions for children and youth ages 5-18 (grades K – 12) will begin Sunday, September 26th, 2021.

Due to covid restrictions limiting the number of children able to attend sessions and low attendance rate last year - interviews for parents and children will be held prior to registering for level 2 (2nd year) preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Please call the Faith Formation Office to set up a meeting time and date. Letters to schedule and confirm meeting dates and times will be sent to parents and guardians prior to the beginning of sessions.

Due to some recent changes made by the diocese, parents and guardians of teens entering into Confirmation Preparation, (1st & 2nd year) sessions will also receive an e-mail and letter inviting them to the annual beginning of the year meeting which will be held in early September.

Do you have a family member or friend who has questions about the Catholic Church or is a Catholic who may have missed receiving some of their Sacraments? All Are Welcome! Adults and children over the age of 9 who have **not** been Baptized are invited to attend **RCIA** (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) and **RCIA Adapted for Children** (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults Adapted for Children). This is an opportunity that allows adults and children to inquire about the Church to ask questions or clarify what they may have heard, followed by a period that provides fundamental information of the Church: Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, Prayer and Community. Adults, Children and youth who have been Baptized in the Catholic Church or a Trinitarian Baptism and have not received further Sacraments, are invited to attend continuing education for the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation. These sessions, which can be done on an individual or group basis, are a personal and enlightening way to learn more about our Catholic Faith and preparation to receive Sacraments.

The Story of St. Martha

Friendship and Service – Martha, Mary, and Jesus

The gospel of Luke includes what is arguably the most well-known story of Martha and her sister Mary, when they have Jesus to their home for dinner. Martha likely felt slightly flustered before his arrival, making sure everything was tidy and in order. Once he arrived, she was still busy preparing the food. As a hostess, Martha was striving to ensure that Jesus felt welcomed and at home in her house, and was upset that Mary did nothing to help her:

She had a sister named Mary [who] sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me" (Luke 10:39-40).

Such a request does not seem unreasonable, and Jesus understands that Martha's concern is legitimate. Yet he reminds her that while she is "anxious and worried about many things," Mary's desire to learn from Jesus is "the better part" (Luke 10:41-42).

This account in Martha's life reminds us not to become anxious about the things we're facing to our spiritual detriment. Martha was so concerned with serving Jesus and those around her that she missed out on the opportunity to learn from him.

Faith and Love – The Death and Resurrection of Martha's Brother

In John 11, when Martha's brother Lazarus contracted a

terrible illness, she sent Jesus a message with the hope that he would come and heal him. However, Jesus did not arrive until four days after Lazarus's death. Martha did not react to Jesus' late arrival with sorrow or anger, but with calm understanding:

Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. [But] even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you" (John 11:21-22).

Even though her brother was already dead, Martha had faith that Jesus could still perform a miracle with his life. She believed this, because she believed that Jesus was the prophesied Messiah:

Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:23-27).

Jesus was able to use Martha's brother's death and resurrection as a stunning example of His power – showing that he can conquer death – and proving that he truly is the Son of God. He showed Martha that he not only loved her family – "Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus" (John 11:5) – but the entire world.

What is a Novena?

The word novena is taken from "novem," the Latin word for nine. A novena is made up of nine days of prayer and meditation usually to ask God for special prayer requests or petitions. Novenas are often used to ask specific saints to pray for us. The Saint Jude Novena, for example, is prayed to ask Saint Jude to intercede on behalf of a request that seems especially dire.

Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles. Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension into heaven, so they went to an upper room along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, (Acts 1:14) and joined constantly in prayer for nine days. These nine days of constant prayer by the Apostles at the direction of Jesus led up to Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as "tongues of fire" (Acts 2:1-4). This pattern of 9 days of prayer is the basis the novenas we pray today.

Thus, the novena is an imitation of the Lord's command to the Apostles when they prayed for 9 days in anticipation of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

PRO-LIFE NEWS

Bishop Chairmen Respond to Extreme Abortion Push in Appropriations Bill

This week, the House Committee on Appropriations will mark up the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) appropriations bill, which currently excludes the 46-year-old Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions including the Weldon Amendment. Eliminating these provisions would force taxpayers to pay for elective abortions and force health care providers and professionals to perform and refer for abortion against their deeply-held beliefs, as well as force employers and insurers to cover and pay for abortion.

Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan of New York, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee for Religious Liberty, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement:

"This is the most extreme pro-abortion appropriations bill that we have seen, effectively mandating healthcare professionals to participate in abortion, and forcing American citizens to pay for abortion with their tax dollars. By eliminating the Hyde Amendment, and other Hyde-like policies, the financial fruits of Americans' labor would advance the destruction of the smallest, most vulnerable humans. Eliminating the Weldon Amendment would be an egregious violation of conscience rights by forcing individuals and entities to perform, pay for, or otherwise participate in an abortion against their beliefs. Abortion is not healthcare nor a 'human service' to anyone. Rather, abortion is inhumane. It is a painful death to an innocent baby, and often leaves women physically harmed and emotionally devastated.

"We implore the House Committee on Appropriations to reverse course on these bills that currently expand taxpayer funding of abortion, and to restore the longstanding, bipartisan Hyde provisions and Weldon Amendment that have saved millions of lives and protected conscience rights. These bills include many other provisions and funding for critically-needed services that we support. Americans' tax dollars should be used for the common good and welfare of all, not to finance abortion or force Americans to violate deeply-held beliefs.

"Further, we ask all Catholics and all people of good will to contact their legislators and make their voices heard. The lives of millions of vulnerable children, and the well-being of their mothers, depend on our advocacy."

The Committee on Pro-Life Activities has sponsored a petition to legislators asking them to preserve the Hyde Amendment. All are encouraged to sign it at NoTaxpayerAbortion.com.

We invite you to register at the Church Office during office hours, pick up a Welcome Packet on the **Welcome Table** in the Gathering Area or online at: www.good-shepherd-church.org.

Though a rather simple act, registration is a sign of one's commitment and responsibility to the parish and allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your **Active membership** and is **essential for participation** in parish programs and sacraments.

What is an **Active Membership**: three points determine active membership:

- **Registration in the parish for a sufficient period of time and use of the envelope system in support of the parish;**
- **Faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days;**
- **Volunteer and participate in Parish activities with time, talent, and treasure as means permit.**

Please note the Facilities and Services of Good Shepherd Church are available to active members.

Emergencies: In cases of emergency, please contact the Parish Office during regular business hours. After hours, please call Amanda at (910)391-3939.

SACRAMENTS

Anointing of the Sick: Call the Church Office (910) 425-1590.

Marriage: Couples are asked not to set a date for their wedding until an initial meeting with the Pastor. Diocesan requirements mandate a minimum six month period of preparation.

Baptism: Parental participation in a program to prepare parents is required. Contact Trisha Martin-Kamionka, 910-425-5617, in the Faith Formation Office at least 3 months in advance of your desired baptismal date to make the proper arrangements.

Sick and Homebound/Hospitalized: Please notify the Parish Office when someone is ill and unable to attend Mass for any significant length of time and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Bulletin Deadline: Requests are due by **12 noon on the Monday prior** to the weekend the announcement is to be published. E-mail your request to: gsbulletinedit@gmail.com.

Special Needs: Handicapped accessible doors are located on the left side of the Gathering Area. Wheelchair seating is available in the front row of **chairs** in the Church. Cars must display a valid handicap sticker or placard to park in the reserved handicap spaces in the Church parking lot.
