

#### **FAITH FORMATION SESSIONS FOR 2021-2022**

Registration is open, youth will be accepted into sessions according to prior attendance and first register - first placement.

Early registration during the month of August is helpful to insure the right number of books and supplies for our children and youth in each level.

Please keep in mind that 2 full years of faith formation is necessary for reception of the Sacrament of First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Sessions for children and youth ages 5-18 (grades K – 12) will begin Sunday, September 26th, 2021.

Due to covid restrictions limiting the number of children able to attend sessions and low attendance rate last year interviews for parents and children will be held prior to registering for level 2 (2nd year) preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Please call the Faith Formation Office to set up a meeting time and date. Letters to schedule and confirm meeting dates and times will be sent to parents and guardians the first week of August.

Due to some recent changes made by the diocese, parents and guardians of teens entering into Confirmation Preparation, (1st & 2nd year) sessions will also receive an e-mail and letter inviting them to the annual beginning of the year meeting which will be held in early September.

## The Transfiguration of the Lord

Both the Roman and Eastern Rite Catholics celebrate this of Christ's life. <mark>church feast today, August 6th, on its traditional date for The primary purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to</mark> both calendars. especially significant; it is among the "12 great feasts" of Our Lord's suffering, death and Resurrection. Eastern Catholicism.

Gospel describes Jesus' Transfiguration during prayer on a mountain. The location of the Transfiguration was probably Mount Hermon in North Galilee, near Caesarea Philippi. This feast describes Jesus at the peak or pinnacle of His earthly life when He reveals Himself to three of His closest disciples, be means of a miraculous and supernatural light. While praying, Jesus was transformed into a shining figure clothed with heavenly glory. It was representing the Law and the Prophets, Moses, the great Law-giver, and Elijah, the great prophet, appeared, speaking with Jesus in His glory.

These representatives of the Law and the Prophets, in their lives on earth, foreshadowed Jesus who is the culmination of the Law and the Prophets. Then "a bright Cloud overshadowed them, and a Voice from the Cloud said, 'This is My beloved Son, with Whom I am well pleased; listen to Him.'" God revealed Jesus as His Son — His beloved — the one in whom He is well pleased and to whom we must listen.




#### The Prayer for Vocations:

In the 8th century, a priest in Lanciano, Italy was experiencing doubts about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In the middle of saying Mass, he said the words of consecration ("This is my body," "This is my blood) and saw the bread and wine transform into real human flesh and blood. The blood coagulated into five globules (later believed to be representative of the five wounds of Christ). Word of the miracle quickly spread, the local archbishop launched an investigation, and the Church approved the miracle.

The flesh is still preserved to this day. Professor of anatomy Odoardo Linoli conducted a scientific analysis of the flesh in 1971 and concluded that the flesh was cardiac tissue, the blood appeared to be fresh blood (as opposed to blood that was 1200 years old), and there was no trace of preservatives.

You can visit the miraculous flesh and blood in the Church of San Francesco in Lanciano, Italy.
