

FAITH FORMATION SESSIONS FOR 2021-2022

Registration is open, youth will be accepted into sessions according to prior attendance and first register - first placement.

Early registration during the month of August is helpful to insure the right number of books and supplies for our children and youth in each level.

Please keep in mind that 2 full years of faith formation is necessary for reception of the Sacrament of First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Sessions for children and youth ages 5-18 (grades K - 12) will begin Sunday, September 26th, 2021.

Due to covid restrictions limiting the number of children able to attend sessions and low attendance rate last year - interviews for parents and children will be held prior to registering for level 2 (2nd year) preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Please call the Faith Formation Office to set up a meeting time and date. Letters to schedule and confirm meeting dates and times will be sent to parents and guardians the first week of August.

Due to some recent changes made by the diocese, parents and guardians of teens entering into Confirmation Preparation, (1st & 2nd year) sessions will also receive an e-mail and letter inviting them to the annual beginning of the year meeting which will be held in early September.

FAITH FORMATION

RCIA:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is an on-going invitation and process for those attracted to or interested in knowing more about the Catholic Faith.

Adults who have not been baptized or have received baptism and not received sacraments after baptism are welcome to inquire and take part in this process or **Adult Education**.

Adult Education:

Adults who have received the Sacrament of Baptism, attend the Holy Mass, are in need, have the desire to receive the remaining Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and Confirmation) are welcome to take part in adult education. These sessions are particular to the sacraments that have not been received. Meeting dates/times are on-going and determined for the convenience of those attending.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children:

Children of the age of discernment who have not received the Sacrament of Baptism are welcome to take part in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children. Sessions will begin on September 26th.

PRAYER FOR THE RCIA

O God, we thank you for implanting the gift of faith in human hearts. We thank you for sending Jesus your son, as the fullness of your love. May his life and mission lead us to share in your divine life. We ask you to bless in a special way all inquirers, catechumens, and candidates, who have generously responded to the invitation of Jesus: "Come follow me." Help them to persevere in their journey of faith despite any difficulties. Bless all those who minister through the RCIA process so that, under the guidance of your holy spirit, they may lead others to a life of faith in Jesus Christ. Grant that all parishioners will take an active role in bringing new members into the Church. Call us all to a renewal of our faith, and inspire us all to be your light in the world.

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient or impending surgery. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. The primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

If you have impending surgery, or have been recently diagnosed with a life threatening ailment, ask to be anointed. If you would like to be anointed, contact the Office.



Good Shepherd Catholic Church Inclement Weather Policy

In order to help ensure the safety of our Parishioners, the Church and other facilities will be closed and religious education, groups, committees and clubs will not meet or use Parish facilities and grounds under the following conditions:

- When Cumberland County is under eminent threat of a Tropical Storm or Hurricane.
- If there is a threat of ice on the roads or roads are covered with ice and/or snow.
- Electricity is out at the Church. We will notify you if there is a power outage at the Church through Social Media, the Parish app and Flocknote.
- The governor declares a state of emergency asking people to stay home in Cumberland County.

In all cases the Parish Staff will communicate over Social Media and Flocknote let the members of the parish know that we have closed and to let them know when we have opened the facilities back up for regular activities.

Eucharistic Miracle

A modern day Eucharistic Miracle. Fr. Johnson Karnoor, pastor of the Church of Saint Mary in Chirattakonam, relates what happened: On April 28, 2001, in the parish church of St. Mary of Chirattakonam, we began the Novena to St. Jude Thaddeus as we did every year. At 8:49am, I exposed the Most Holy Sacrament in the monstrance for public adoration. After a few moments I saw what appeared to be three dots in the Holy Eucharist. I then stopped praying and began to look at the monstrance, also inviting the faithful to admire the three dots. I then asked the faithful to remain in prayer and reposed the monstrance in the tabernacle. On April 30th, I celebrated the Holy Mass and on the following day I left for Trivandrum. On Saturday morning, the 5th of May 2001, I opened the church for the usual liturgical celebrations. I vested for Mass and went to open the tabernacle to see what had happened to the Eucharist in the monstrance. I immediately noted in the Host, a figure, to the likeness of a human face. I was deeply moved and asked the faithful to kneel and begin praying. I thought I alone could see the face so I asked the altar server what he noticed in the monstrance. He answered: 'I see the figure of a man.' I noticed that the rest of the faithful were looking intently at the monstrance ("Eucharistic Miracle of Chirattakonam, Archdiocese of Trivandrum, India, 2001," The Real Presence Eucharistic Education and Adoration Association, 2006, web 8 Jan. 2015).

This occurrence reminds us that Eucharistic Miracles continue to happen in our own day. Again, these are extraordinary instances where Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist is made visible and sensible to us; we must never forget that there is a miracle every time the Mass is celebrated. The Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ – the extraordinary "Eucharistic Miracles" are meant to remind us of this awesome reality. We can receive Jesus Christ Himself in the Eucharist every day if we wish! We can also visit Jesus by spending time in Eucharistic Adoration. The miracle of the Eucharist is at the heart of the Catholic faith: it is the greatest of our Treasures.
