



What is "Family Catechesis"?

Many parents across the United States have indicated they do not think they know enough about our Catholic Faith to teach their children. They have also stated they cannot fit adult formation into their busy schedules in order to learn more about the Faith. In response, the Atlanta Archdiocese, of which we are a part, has developed resources for parishes to help parents grow in their faith and relationship with Jesus so they can feel confident to share the Faith with their children. These resources can be incorporated into the existing class schedule so parents do not have to add anything else to their busy schedules. At a recent catechist meeting, the catechists voted to include several Family Catechesis opportunities in the coming year for the regularly scheduled morning sessions. They also voted to use the materials provided by the Atlanta Archdiocese, which focus on simple ways to include Catholic practices in our homes that help all family members grow in the Faith. Stay tuned for more details on this wonderful opportunity for families to grow in love and faith in our Lord AND enjoy some good family time.

This coming year, our Parish will help families understand and embrace the truth that their families are holy and what happens in daily life is holy—just as holy as the life that happens in the Parish.



WHAT IS THE ALMS HOUSE?

Associated Local Ministries in Service Helping Others in Unfortunate Situations and Experiences

The ALMS HOUSE was established as a non-profit agency in February 1984 by twelve local churches of various denominations. Good Shepherd was one of the original churches and has been part of the ALMS HOUSE since it was incorporated as a non-profit organization. ALMS HOUSE serves a geographical area in and around Hope Mills. The ALMS HOUSE PROVIDES a food pantry (which includes personal hygiene items as well as cleaning products) and a clothing closet - with household items (small appliances; dishes; linens, etc.) The ALMS HOUSE is able to assist with past due utility bills. Bibles are given to anyone who would like to have one.

During the school year, the KAPP (Kids Assistance Program Plus) provides bags of nutritious food to school children weekly to eleven local schools. School social workers determine children within these schools who may not have food for the weekend Each child receives a bag. (They often request and receive a bag for a sibling at home.) During the summer months, the ALMS HOUSE provides bag lunches to children and families in the neighborhood. KAPP also provides assistance for seniors in the area.

Hearty meals are provided and served daily by ALMS HOUSE volunteers as well as various groups and individuals 365 days a year. These meals are served at the Ellison Street location. Approximately 1000 meals are served each month.

Currently, multiple churches representing many denominations are actively involved, and make up the Board of Directors of the Alms House. These churches support the ALMS HOUSE by providing funding, food, and volunteers. For several years, Nick Foti served faithfully on the ALMS HOUSE Board of Directors as representative from Good Shepherd and as liason between the ALMS HOUSE and Good Shepherd. Thank you, Nick, for your many years of faithful service.

Karen Weller, an active member of Good Shepherd, serving on the Bulletin Inserters and Garden Committee Ministries (as well as a volunteer in the ALMS HOUSE food pantry) will be stepping up to replace Nick as liason and member of the Board of Directors of the ALMS HOUSE. 

First Friday Devotion for Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Our Lord said to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, "I promise you, in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving the sacraments; my divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in that last moment."

Requirements of this Devotion:

- 1. The devotion is practiced for *nine* consecutive First Fridays of the month
- 2. Confession (sometime within a week before or after the First Friday) -
 - (Recommended to ensure proper state of grace)
- 3. Holy Communion
- 4. Done with the intent and spirit for reparation for offenses against the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Why Nine First Fridays?

The number nine is traditionally associated with a novena and finds its origin in the nine days that the apostles spent in prayer before Pentecost. A novena provides an extended amount of time for preparation and interior renewal.

The Reason for this Devotion:

The devotion is offered in reparation for sinners who commit offenses against the Sacred Heart of Jesus. These offenses are listed in the Act of Reparation Prayer made to the Sacred Heart. Jesus told Saint Margaret Mary that he wanted to spread the love of his heart through her and that she would reveal to many people the grace he desires always to bestow on humanity. In her vision, Margaret Mary saw Jesus take her heart and place it within his, setting it aflame with divine love that continued to burn in her heart as it returned to her body.

What does devotion to the Sacred Heart mean? Christ described his heart, according to Margaret Mary, as "the heart that has so loved humanity that it has spared nothing, even exhausting and consuming itself in testimony of its love." Thus, the Sacred Heart represents the fullness of God's love for humanity and the overflowing generosity of Christ's gift of self in the act of salvation.

First Saturday Devotion for Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

During her apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to Lucia, "I shall come to ask...that on the First Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world...Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the first Saturday for five successive months."

Requirements of this Devotion:

- 1. The devotion is practiced for *five* consecutive First Saturdays of the month
- 2. Confession (sometime within a week before or after First Saturday)
- 3. Holy Communion
- 4. Pray five decades of the Rosary
- 5. Keep company with Mary for at least 15 minutes, meditating on the Mysteries included in the Rosary (This is to be done *in addition to praying the Rosary*)
- 6. Done with the intent and spirit for reparation for offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Why Five First Saturdays?

The idea is to make us persevere in these devotional acts for five months, to overcome the initial obstacles. Once this is done, Our Lady knows that the person will -- if the person faithfully cooperates with her grace -become attracted to her pure and Immaculate Heart and persevere in practicing such devotion on *all* First Saturdays, working towards our own personal sanctification, and for the salvation of others.

The Reason for this Devotion:

The devotion is offered in reparation for sinners who commit offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Against her Immaculate Conception;
- 2. Against her Perpetual Virginity;
- 3. Against her Divine Maternity, while refusing to accept Mary also as the Mother of Humanity;

4. Offenses committed by those who publicly attempt to instill indifference, scorn and even hatred for this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children;

5. Offenses committed by those who insult, reject and dishonor Mary in her images.

Liturgical Ministries

<u>Sacristans</u> are responsible for setting the Altar and see to the care of the various candles located in the Sanctuary. They are also responsible for ensuring everything is in order for the celebration of Mass, allowing the Celebrant to concentrate solely on the liturgy.

"The sacristan diligently arranges the liturgical books, the vestments, and other things that are necessary for the celebration of Mass." *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), #105(a)*

The term Sacristan comes from the Latin word, sacer, which means sacred. Sacristans are often behind the scenes as prayerful ministers that bring to mind the words of Jesus when He said we should not do good works just to gain rewards (Matthew 6:1).

Lectors nourish the Faith of the community by proclaiming the Word of God in an audible and intelligible manner to the community.

"The lector is instituted to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture, with the exception of the Gospel. He may also announce the intentions for the Prayer of the Faithful and, in the absence of a psalmist, proclaim the Psalm between the readings." *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), #99*)

On Word of God Sunday, January 2022, Pope Francis said of the Office of Lector, "They are called to the important work of serving the Gospel of Jesus, of proclaiming him, so that his consolation, his joy and his liberation can reach everyone."

Extraordinary Ministers assist with the Celebration by distributing the Precious Body and Blood of Christ to His people.

"A duly instituted acolyte, as an extraordinary minister, may, if necessary, assist the priest in giving Communion to the people. If Communion is given under both kinds, when no deacon is present, the acolyte administers the chalice to the communicants or holds the chalice if Communion is given by intinction." *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), #191*)

In his Angelus address of Sunday, August 16, 2015, Pope Francis said, "The Eucharist is Jesus who gives himself entirely to us. Nourishing ourselves on Him and abiding in Him through Eucharistic communion, if we do so in faith, transforms our lives into a gift to God and to our brothers and sisters."

<u>Altar Servers</u> carry the cross, the processional candles, hold the book for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar, carry the incense and censer, present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people, wash the hands of the priest, assist the priest celebrant and deacon.

"In the earthly liturgy we take part in a foretaste of that heavenly liturgy which is celebrated in the holy city of Jerusalem toward which we journey as pilgrims, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God, a minister of the holies and of the true tabernacle." *SACROSANCTUM CONCILIUM, Ch. 1, §1, #8*)

Serving on the Altar is a very special way to serve our Lord. In May 2021, Pope Francis gave this message to Altar Servers: "Animated by respect and interior recollection, your service as an altar server will become a Profession of Faith for the community. Offer Jesus your hands, your thoughts and your time, and He will not fail to reward you, giving you true joy and making you feel where the most complete happiness is."
