







Our memories of the attack on our nation are intertwined with memories of how we human beings are natural symbol-makers. In one parish, as a candlelight vigil ended, the assembly, without being instructed, took their candles and stood shoulder to shoulder, down the steps and along the city streets for a quarter mile. Slowly, people came out of their houses bearing tapers and candles. In the first hours of crisis, we stood vigil, we prayed from the heart, and we celebrated the human ability to draw light out of terrible darkness. Stories of that terrible day necessarily drift to tales of heroism, courage, dignity, faith, solidarity, hope, community. The church learned long ago through hard experience that "the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church." Perhaps the victims of 9/11 have gifts to bring that we are only just discovering as believers in a just and loving God. They are teaching us still, and today is a day for lighting candles at the table and being silent for a moment before the abundance of God's gifts. Today reminds us that we are capable of acts of indescribable beauty even in the face of great evil.</p> | |

This day speaks not only to those who have answered the call and volunteered to be a catechist, but to all of us through the blessing of our Baptism.

We, strengthened by the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation are to bear the love of Christ; share His teaching, the message of the Gospel; the teaching of the Church with all He brings into our lives.

This year, the Church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 19, 2021, and the theme is:

“Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed.”

Those who the parish community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry on Sunday, September 19th during the 11:30 Mass.

RCIA:

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is an on-going invitation and process for those attracted to or interested in knowing more about the Catholic Faith.

Adults who have not been baptized or have received baptism and not received sacraments after baptism are welcome to inquire and take part in this process or **Adult Education**.

Adult Education:

Adults who have received the Sacrament of Baptism, attend the Holy Mass, are in need, have the desire to receive the remaining Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and Confirmation) are welcome to take part in adult education. These sessions are particular to the sacraments that have not been received. Meeting dates/times are on-going and determined for the convenience of those attending.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children:

Children of the age of discernment who have not received the Sacrament of Baptism are welcome to take part in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children. Sessions will begin on September 26th.

DID YOU KNOW?

As we begin a new catechetical year it is important for us to remember the importance of the Sacraments we receive in the Church and what they bring to us.

Baptism not only purifies from all sins, but also makes that person “**a new creature**,” an adopted son/daughter of God, who has become a “**partaker of the divine nature**,” a member of *Christ and co-heir with Him, and a temple of the Holy Spirit?*

The Most Holy Trinity give the baptized sanctifying grace, the grace of *justification*:

Enabling them to believe in God, to hope in Him, and to love Him through the theological virtues;

Giving them the power to live and act under the prompting of the Holy Spirit through the gifts of the Holy Spirit;

Allowing them to grow in goodness through moral virtues.

Thus the whole organism of the Christian's supernatural life has its roots in Baptism. CCC1265/1266

The Gospel of St. Matthew 28:18-20 Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. 

We need to convert our pains and suffering into the Cross of Christ

Dear beloved parishioners, Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ. I hope and pray all is good with you all.

On September 14, the Catholic Church celebrates the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross and On September 15, the Feast of Mother of Sorrows.

The meaning of the word **Cross- Christ Rescued Our Sinful Souls**.

Ann Thomas tells this story of herself. She was at a garage sale with her friend Betty. Ann had just sorted through a tray of trinkets. Betty came up and asked, "Any luck?" "No!" said Ann. "It's just a pile of junk." She stepped aside to let Betty see for herself. Betty took one look at the pile, picked up a tarnished old cross and said, "I can't believe it. I have found a treasure! This cross is made of antique silver." When Betty got home, she cleaned the cross and polished it. Later Betty's seven-year-old son, Bobby picked up the cross, held it

reverently in his hands and looked at it for a long time. Suddenly he began to cry. "What's wrong?" asked Betty. Bobby said, "I can't help it. I was looking at Jesus on the cross.

Ann ended the story saying, three people looked at the same cross. I only saw junk; Betty saw a treasure and Bobby saw Jesus. The Feast of Exaltation of Holy Cross reminds us to see Jesus and appreciate the price he paid for our salvation each time we look at a cross for two reasons: 1. To understand the history of the True Cross and 2. To appreciate better the importance of the symbol and reality of Christ's sacrificial love, namely, the cross in the daily life of every Christian.

The Cross of Jesus is the symbol of self-surrendering love. The Crucifix /Cross is the symbol of God's loving and sacrificial offering of Himself in a humble and total self-emptying love for all of us. It represents the cross-bearing Christ leading us in our life's journey of pain and suffering, carrying his heavier cross and still encouraging us, strengthening us and supporting us.

Constantine won the battle over Maxentius. Indebted to the God of Christians for his victory at the Milvian Bridge, October 28, AD 312, Constantine became a Christian catechumen. The Emperor issued the Edit of Milan (in 313), guaranteeing Christian's religious tolerance throughout the Roman Empire. He declared Christianity the official religion of the Roman Empire and commanded that the sign of the cross be placed on all the Roman standards and on the shields of all the soldiers.

We generally speak of crosses given by Nature (disease like this COVID19, natural disasters, death) crosses involved in doing our duties faithfully, crosses given by the others and crosses we create for ourselves. Now, the question is how should we carry our crosses?

We should not carry crosses cursing our fate as does the donkey carrying its heavy load or expecting a heavenly reward as a hired worker works for his wages. We are taught to offer these sufferings with Jesus to the Father as gifts of love, in reparation for our sins and the sins of the world. The true spirit of carrying our crosses is to do so like a loving spouse who nurses his/her paralyzed spouse or sick child with sacrificial love and dedicated self-surrender.

We need to convert our pains and suffering into the cross of Christ, may be by accepting the sacrifice and suffering involved in helping others and sharing our blessings with others, may be by welcoming the pain involved in controlling our evil habits and tendencies and in practicing our faith and may be by serving others with sacrificial, agape love and commitment like a loving spouse who nurses his/her sick child or spouse.

So, let us approach our cross not with sorrow but with joy, not as a symbol of death but of life, not as a cause for fear but of hope, not as an instrument of cruelty and hatred but of eternal love. And this how Our Blessed Mother approached all her crosses in her life from the time of her consumption of Jesus in her womb to Jesus death on the Cross (The Mother of Sorrows). She kept all her suffering in her heart and focused on doing God's will. She did not expect any reward for her suffering, but God rewarded her the joy of her Son's resurrection. Our Blessed Mother Mary is the model for all of us to carry our crosses humbly and patiently. Let us pray and try to follow the footsteps of Our Blessed Mother Mary.

Happy Feast of Exaltation of The Cross and the Feast of Mother of Sorrows. See you all in the Church.




