

The Holy Stitchers would like to thank you personally for your support on keeping us alive so we can do our missions, such as supporting nursing homes, hospitals, homeless people, pro-life and our soldiers.

Just in case you don't know how we help: We make lap quilts, shawls and hats for nursing homes; we help pro-life by making receiving blankets; we help hospitals by providing packages that include receiving blankets, booties, hats (all made with baby yarn), and burial gowns made from wedding dresses. We give hats and blankets to the Homeless and Urban Ministries when requested. We also make ornaments for the Christmas Share Tree. We help a lot with our church and other churches with altar cloths, vestments, etc. We make rosaries and brown and green scapulars for the Legion of Mary and care packages for our soldiers at Fort Liberty. Once in a while, we make lunch for the seniors in our parish. These are just a few of the many things we make and provide.

If you would like to join us, we get together every Thursday from 9:30am until whatever time. Women and men are welcome. We teach how to sew and many crafts. We are downstairs in the Social Hall, Room 6.

We accept donations of monies, gift cards, yarn and material. We have a box in the Gathering Area for your donations. Please do not leave cards or monies in the box. You can leave these at the Parish Office or give to one of the Holy Stitchers Ladies.
