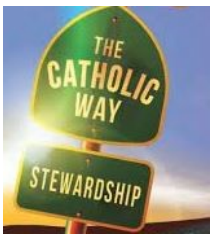

Just to prove to all that age is just a number, I am 80 years young and am volunteering to assist with the Confirmation I class this year. I am so excited to help these young people in their faith journey.



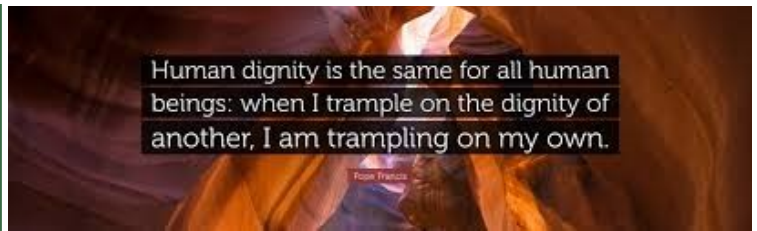
Spend time in prayer and ask God which ministry He is calling you to be a part of. The ministry will benefit from your involvement and you will be blessed to be involved.

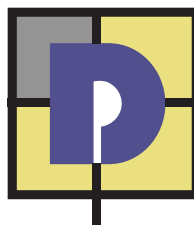
